

Well antelope were once again grazing on the bottom of what was Boysen lake. Water levels are down 40% or more because of a severe drought in the Wind River Mountains. This has been caused by a small El Nino according to Wyoming meteorologists. Compared to a year ago, when the county's largest city received only about 43 percent of its normal precipitation for the entire year, Riverton has experienced a mere fraction, about 10 percent, of the more than three-quarters of inch of average April moisture in 2007. The report from the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the Natural Resources Conservation Service, shows snowpack, streamflow and reservoir levels are below average. Hopefully we will have a wet spring to bring some relief. Oh well, let's forget the fish and have antelope instead!
