## Do We Need A Dance?

It is that time of year that as President I have to start looking at our year and budget. One thing that has really stood out the last few years is the low turnout to the dance that follows the alumni banquet. The reality is that bands are very hard to come by (at least ones that our alumni would like to dance to). We have tried Disc Jockeys to be able to provide music for all generations. We have even booked bands a year in advance only to have them pull out. The dance is one of our biggest headaches the alumni board members have. The band and/or DJ's are costing roughly \$400-\$500 and participation has been around 20-40 people. What the board needs to know is if the dance should continue with rising costs, low band choice and low participation. The alumni board puts this on for you, the alumni. Costs are rising for the newsletter to be printed and mailed and for the banquet/dance to be put on. The \$5 dues should help offset these costs but only 100-200 people pay dues each year. We send out over 1000 newsletters each year. Our budget is going in the hole. We spend roughly \$1500-\$2000 a year and bring in only \$1000-\$1500 a year. That is going around \$500 a year in the hole. Some years we have people give extra donations, and we are grateful for that, but it still isn't helping us stay above ground. Some years are definitely better than others and now with gas prices, we are expecting the number to go down for our banquet. We need you, the alumni, to stand up and let us know your feelings! Should the dance go? Should we not send newsletters to those that don't pay dues? We will start emailing newsletters next year if you keep us up on your email addresses. These are questions we are pondering but would love to hear from you. We hope to hear from you and welcome your responses.

# The Yellowstone Drug Store Moves After Over 50 Years in Historic Building

The Yellowstone drug was a business that started back in 1910. It was originally in the old Shoshoni Motel and moved in the 1950's to another historical building which was it's resting place until this year. The historical building we all knew as the drugstore was also home to a clothing store, a post office, and the First National Bank of Shoshoni.


Art and Doris Zube purchased the legendary "Best Malts and Shakes in Wyoming" store on March 1, 1977 from Leon Palmer. The Zube's also were the ones who started the familiar bumper sticker that announced "I had a malt at the Yellowstone Drug in Shoshoni, Wy". Art had a pharmacy there for a few years, but discontinued it "since there isn't a doctor in Shoshoni anyway." The store was then owned for many years by Marge Frymire.

Many alumni of Shoshoni could understand the popularity of this malt shop considering handfuls of them have worked there. During regular season in the 1980's the store would sell about 200 malts per day six days a week, sometimes making 400 in the summer tourist season. In the early 2000's the record was somewhere between 50,000-55,000 malts and shakes/year. The last known record for them in a day was 710.

The business, which is now owned by Rachael Goff, has relocated to what many will call the old DJ's, Dodies or TJ's restaurants. It is at 502 E. 2nd street.

#### One Life Saved As One Is Lost

Darren Collins, son of SHS alumnus Jim Collins '84, lost his life due to a tragic case of meningitis, but his beating heart will live on through another.

Darren died March 1 at the Denver Children's Hospital after being rushed there from Cody on Feb. 28 with a severe case of meningitis. That same day, Garrett Ross, who is an 8-year-old boy from Colorado, found out he had irreversible coronary artery disease was also put in the hospital. Just hours after Darren passed away, his heart was beating inside Garrett.

Jim and Rebecca Jansen, Darren's mom, who now lives in Cheyenne were able to meet the parents of Garrett in the waiting room at the hospital.

Because of Darren's funeral, Jim wasn't able to meet Garrett until March 12. That was when Jim was able to feel his son's heart beating in Garrett's chest.

In addition to his heart, Darren donated six organs. His kidneys went to two young Colorado girls, and his liver and lungs also went to people in Colorado.


